Year 7 to High School - 2022

South Australian Year 7 public school students will be taught in high school from term 1, 2022. This move will bring South Australia in line with other jurisdictions.

Each school will be supported to make sure that the transition is managed in a way that reflects their local community's needs. Individual implementation plans will cover areas such as workforce planning, Facilities and resource management, and engagement with parents. For high schools the plans will also involve approaches to learning and teaching, and for ensuring the wellbeing of year 7s. Staff, Schools and families will be provided with regular project updates and there will be opportunities to provide input and feedback into the process.

Our commitment for transitioning year 7s to high school is to:

- make sure year 7s thrive in a high school setting, not just in terms of their education, but also their social and emotional wellbeing.
- Make sure schools are involved in the process, and that implementation reflects local realities
- Provide appropriate support to teachers in transition.

Bringing year 7 into a high school setting will make it easier to deliver specialist year 7 courses and good grouped curriculum subjects and will align South Australia's public schools with other state and South Australian education sectors.

Consideration may be given as to whether some public high schools begin accepting year 7 enrolments in 2020 or 2021. More information will be provided as the project progresses.

Coronavirus Update

Dear Parents and Caregivers,

Public health officials have updated advice over the weekend regarding Novel Coronavirus. We would like to underline the importance of following this advice and alert you to the new national information hotline 1800 020 080.

The updated advice from SA Health is effective from **Saturday 1 February 2020**:

Children or staff who travelled to mainland China must isolate themselves in their home for 14 days after leaving mainland China if they left mainland China on or after 1 February 2020.

Children or staff who have been in close contact with a confirmed case must isolate themselves in their homes for 14 days after last contact.

Children or staff who have returned from Wuhan, Hubei Province, China must isolate themselves in their home for 14 days after leaving Hubei Province.

Staff and students in these circumstances must not attend schools, preschools or early childhood center's and should not engage with other students.

Symptoms may include fever, cough, shortness of breath, fatigue and sore throat. People with these symptoms who have travelled to China or have had close contact with a confirmed case should see a doctor or attend a hospital and call ahead so they can prepare.

Everyone should practice good hygiene and other measures to protect against infections. Good hygiene includes:

- Washing your hands often with soap and water
- Using a tissue and covering your mouth when you cough or sneeze.

We will keep you updated if new information becomes available.
