We would appreciate it if all payments could be made **by noon** each day to allow us to balance and bank.

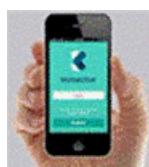

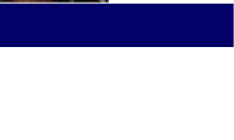
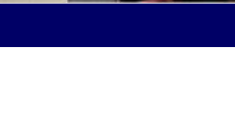
