Reading is a school site priority from Preschool to Year 7 here at North Ingle. We recognise the importance of effective literacy skills and the impact this has on an individual's success in life, health and wellbeing. Phonics is one aspect of the 6 reading components. The Department for Education is supporting schools to undertake a [Phonics check](#) assessment for every Year 1 student. Our teachers have commenced this data collection and will use the results of the assessment to inform their teaching of reading with relevant resources and to follow up with students who need additional support. This initiative is part of the Literacy Guarantee agenda to improve literacy in South Australia in a world class system. Last term's Book Fair was a great success and now Mandy Dicker, our Library SSO, along with the Book Week Committee, have planned some very exciting activities to celebrate the Book Week theme of 'Find Your Treasure'. Acclaimed children's author Ms Jane Jolly will be presenting some workshops at a minimal cost to students.

Our 2018 Father's Day Stall fundraiser will be held on **Wednesday 29th August** (Term 3, Week 6).

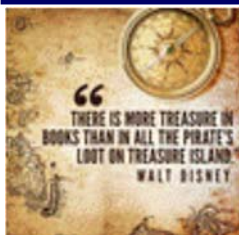

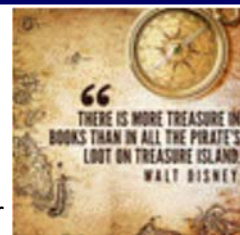
If you would like to donate any gifts, please put them in the box in the front office labelled 'Father's Day Stall Donations'.

Maths R/1WV class

In Maths we have been focussing on learning about money. We have been recognising, describing and ordering Australian coins according to their value. We have been involved in activities that have enabled us to describe the features and numerals on the coins and to have an understanding that the value of the coins is not related to their size.



These students are sorting coins and using the coins to make a man shape and recognising basic coins.



Premier's Reading Challenge



Have you finished the Challenge? It has been wonderful to hear from many of our students that they have completed their reading and are ready to submit their forms.

The Premier's Reading Challenge finishes on Friday 7th September (Week 7). You still have time to read and enjoy sharing books at home and at school.

At least 1.57 million books were read by 130, 654 students completing the Challenge in 2017. Last year 80 of our students completed the awards. It would be great to have 100% of North Ingle school students completing the challenge this year.
