Coronavirus Update

The Federal Government has announced it will extend a travel ban on foreign nationals who have recently been in mainland China for a further week from 22 February 2020, to protect Australians from the risk of coronavirus disease (COVID-19).

Restrictions remain in place for people who have recently returned to Australia from mainland China, with the following advice issued to staff and parents about attendance at schools and early childhood facilities.

In the following scenarios you **cannot** attend school or an early childhood centre:

- If you have left or transited through mainland China - you must isolate yourself until 14 days after leaving China.
- If you have been in close contact with a confirmed case of novel coronavirus - you must isolate yourself for 14 days after last contact with the confirmed case.

At this stage, SA Health advises that travelers from Hong Kong, Indonesia, Japan, Singapore and Thailand who have not been to mainland China are not required to self-isolate unless they are unwell, in which case they should seek medical assistance.

Practicing good hygiene

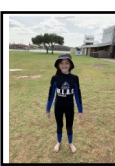
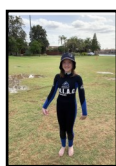
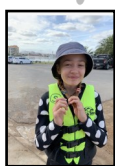
Everyone can protect against infections by practicing good hygiene. Encourage all children to:

On Thursday 20th February our class and the Year 6's from Miss McNamara's class all came to school at 8:20am (earlier than normal). We were getting ready to go to Aquatics at West Lakes. After the role was called and everyone had arrived, we lined up in a single file (sort of) to get on the bus.

Once everyone was on the bus, we headed off to West Lakes. It was really loud on the bus and everyone was talking. I think it's because we were all excited. I was too because last year I was a Year 5, however this year I was happy that I now was able to go.

When we arrived, we had a safety talk from one of the leaders called Matt. While he was talking we were putting sunscreen on, he was just saying that we had to be respectful to other people because it's a public place and our teachers also told us before we left. He was also saying that we have two five-minute breaks and one thirty-minute break.

When the talk was over we went into our groups that we planned the day before. I was in a group of three and the people in my group were, Luke, Josh, Jayden, Izaiah, Cameron, Pervash and myself. Our group leader for the first activity was called Mia (we had different leaders for each activity). As our group had an odd number of people, we joined with another group for most of the activities.

The next activity for our group was surfing. We had to cross the road to Tennyson Beach, because if we did the surfing at the lake, it wouldn't work because there are no waves on the lake. When we got there the person that was our leader for this activity was saying that we have to be careful of the rips and that we have to swim with the rip to get out, not against it. Once he had finished our safety talk, we got to surf. It was fun and it was a little bit challenging.

When we got back from the beach we had our thirty-minute break, it wasn't as much of a rush because it was a longer period of time to do everything. When the break was over we went back into our groups and were told of the next activity. Our group had sailing.

Sailing was cool there were eight of us in one boat, some people were trying to tip the boat over, but eventually they stopped. Probably the best part of sailing was when we steered the boat. In my opinion I would say that sailing was the second-best activity, but the last activity was by far the best.

The last activity was snorkelling. I've always wanted to do snorkelling, which made the experience even better. It was a bit difficult to use the equipment at first, but eventually I got the hang of it. It was even better when we swam out far because we were able to feed the fish. At first when we looked underwater there was nothing there, but when we put the food in the water, masses of fish came out of nowhere. It was really cool.

After the last activity we changed back into our school clothes. It was hectic in the change rooms but I did it. Once everyone came back from changing we all lined up and thanked Matt and everyone else that works there. We travelled back to school on the bus. The bus trip back was basically the same except we were more tired and less talkative.

We arrived back to school at 5:00pm which was a little later than normal. I was explaining to my Dad how good Aquatics was and that it should be open to Year Fives.

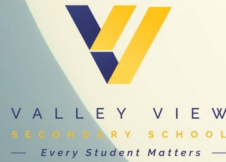
